#### **ABOUT COLLEGE**



#### **Admission Process**

College Of Education is an affiliated college of Savitribai Phule Pune University Pune (http://www.unipune.ac.in/) the admissions in UG, PG courses are done only through the (MHT-CET) Entrance Examination conducted by Government of Maharashtra. The students may apply for admission through Government of Maharashtra MHT CET Portal (www.mahacet.org). The admissions are made strictly on the basis of merit index, availability of seats in the course, as per rules given in the MHT-CET Information Bulletin and rules framed by the Government of Maharashtra from time to time.

After counseling, if a candidate gets admission in the college, He has to fill the <u>Admission Form</u> of the College (Google and PDF Form both), which may be downloaded from the college website (https://dattakrupaedu.in/). It is mandatory for students to fill the above form within seven days of the commencement of classes. The admission will be confirmed only after submitting the application form along with the academic, transfer certificates and the admission fee etc.






### **Social Service**
